

12 PSR Class – 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Circle of Grace – Coffee and Christ – Following 8 am Mass, parents please meet with the PSR Teachers for Coffee, Discussion and Q and A Session.

In this issue we continue our discussion on Discipleship and Encountering Christ:

The Cost of Following Christ

As suggested, the term "follow me" in the Greek translation of the Bible connotes something binding on the individual.

To follow Christ means to submit to his personal lordship. This, in turn, means that one is to identify his life with the life of Christ. For the early followers of Christ, such a commitment frequently entailed great hardship. The Bible records how the followers of Christ were to share in Christ's life and ministry (see Lukev10:1-16). Such commitment meant the apostles forsook their families, homes, and work. (See Luke 5:11; 18:28-30). Ultimately, following Christ means carrying the cross with Him (see Mark 8:34-38).

All this is to say nothing of the some three hundred million Christians who are experiencing some form of persecution today. (See Open Doors). "When God's people are struck down, attacked and even killed ... what responsibility do we have as their brothers and sisters?"

Lastly, we must speak of the relational component of following Jesus. The apostles came to know Jesus as the good shepherd (John 10) and experienced the radical nature of divine love (John 13:1-17). To be a follower of Jesus meant friendship with God (John 14:13-15). It also meant (and means today) that a follower is to continue the work begun by Jesus.

Conclusion

To follow Jesus requires that we become His disciples. However, as with everything else in the spiritual life, it is God who initiates discipleship.

"It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name he may give you. This I command you: love one another." – John 15:16-17

Witnessing to the Faith:

Disciples are called to be witnesses to their faith in their daily lives, sharing their experiences of God's loves with others.

Today's Readings Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4, 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14, Luke 17: 5– 10

Taking Care of Business

When we were kids, my brothers and sisters and I thought that you were not supposed to say the blessing before meals in a restaurant. You were not supposed to flaunt your faith in public. It probably had more to do with fear of being embarrassed if non-believers saw us praying. I think of that when I hear St. Paul telling Timothy, "God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather of power and love and self-control" (2 Timothy 1:7). All three readings mention the difficulties that people of faith will encounter, and each reading has its own way of facing those hardships.

Jesus gives the practical advice: Look at the difficulties of being a disciple as just part of your job. No servant expects to be praised by his master for doing his job. So if the Lord says I must forgive those who hurt me, or be patient with customers, or share what I have with the poor—no problem; it's part of the job of a disciple. If someone I know is in pain, I'm there to support them. Too tired to go to church after work on a holy day? Just taking care of business.

So how do we get the strength and self-control to roll with the punches? Paul reminds us in the second reading to stir the gifts of the Spirit into flame. If you take time to pray every day, if you look for God in other people, if you see difficulties as your share of the cross—you'll find those gifts of faith, power, love, and self-control beginning to grow stronger inside.

We can trust that this is more than just wishful thinking by going to the first reading. When the prophet cries out for help with the misery and violence in the world, he hears God's promise that the vision (of hope for deliverance) will be fulfilled even if it seems to be delayed. We too hear that promise when we start to get discouraged, for God's promise "will not disappoint" (Habakkuk 2:3).
